

Lieutenant Governor of Alberta History Quiz Show! Music Questions (Episodes 19, 20, 21) <u>Answer Key</u>

In these episodes, filmed at the National Music Centre in Calgary, the students will meet on video Calgary's Cowtown Opera Stars, blues harmonica player Perry Gangur, jazz artist Al Muirhead, country artists Lyndsay Butler & Drew Gregory, folk artist, Sandra Sutter, hip-hop artists Kay L and Rubix and members of the rock group, "The Static Shift", as well as the Calgary Fiddlers, an accordion band, Ill FX hip-hop dancers and jazz dancers! The questions will cover the history of musical genres and venues in Alberta; Opera, Blues, Jazz, Country, Hip-Hop, Folk and Rock & Roll, and the Alberta personalities who have played a successful role in bringing Alberta to the musical stage. The Bonus Questions ask about the RCMP Musical Ride, with Constable Nicole Spencer of the RCMP.
